

EDITOR'S REPORT
 FSMTA Executive Board Meeting
 June 11, 2011

Five issues of *The Florida State Music Teacher* newsletter were published during the 2010-2011 membership year. A breakdown of the number of copies printed and the costs for mailing and printing each issue are outlined below.

The total cost for printing and mailing the newsletters this year was \$6244.36. The average cost per issue was \$1248.87. We published two ads for Florida Gulf Coast University Bower School of Music's Steinway Piano Competition, resulting in advertising income of \$400.

The deadline for the August/September issue is July 10. Next year we will be publishing four issues of the newsletter instead of five issues. The publication dates will be on or near the first of the months of August, October, February and June. The deadline for submitting articles will be the 10th of the month before each publication date.

The decision was also made at the November Executive Board meeting to change the way that the FSMTA newsletter is distributed. Beginning with the August 2011 issue, the newsletter will be sent to the membership by email. To assure that all of our members still have access to the newsletter, each Local President will be asked to appoint someone in his or her local association to print and deliver the newsletter to any members without email. For this system to work satisfactorily, it will be very important that Vice-President for Membership Anna Fagan has each member's correct email address. Please send any changes or corrections in your email address to Anna at anna_fagan@hotmail.com. If for any reason you do not receive an issue of the newsletter, remember that every issue of the newsletter since August of 2004 can be found on the FSMTA website at www.fmta.org.
