

Community Service Awards

Each award is given to a student to recognize leadership, achievements, and service to the community in the field of music.

- **The LeRoy Greenspan Memorial Community Service Award** is given to a high school senior or junior who has received approval for early admission to college. Students are judged on achievements in the last three years of high school.
- **The Local President's Community Service Award** is awarded to a ninth grade student. Students are judged on achievements in the seventh, eighth, and ninth grades.

Each county may declare a winner annually for each award. A state winner will be declared annually for each award.

The President of the local Music Teachers Association will appoint a committee to select the county winner of both awards. If an applicant is a student of a member of the selection committee, the President will select a replacement for that committee member. A certificate and a plaque are given to each county winner by FSMTA. The local Association may also elect to give a plaque. These awards should be presented at the student's high school Senior Awards Assembly.

A state winner for both awards will be selected from the county winner applicants. Three judges are appointed by the State Community Service Awards Chairman. None of the judges may be the teacher of the county winners. If possible, none of the judges should be from a county that has submitted an application. The winners are presented a certificate and a cash award at the annual FSMTA State Conference.
