Following a delectable dinner, Dr. Christopher Johnson played a full piano recital, featuring works by Liszt, Beethoven, Chopin and Gershwin. Dr. Johnson, a former student of member Angela Baptiste, was the Florida Featured Artist for the Conference. The success of the recital was evidenced by the significant number of encores Dr. Johnson played. Income from the Gala will be used for scholarship enhancement.

The winner of the 2006 Local Presidents Community Service Award is Joshua Breitwieser of Manatee County, District VIII. A check in the amount of \$100 and a plaque were presented to him at the 2006 FSMTA Conference in St. Petersburg. Joshua personally expressed his gratitude and sincere appreciation to the membership for the honor of being selected as recipient of the award.



Joshua has studied piano for 10 years with Nancy Bjorklund, who says of him, "He has turned out to be one of the best students I have taught over these past thirty-six years". She adds, he is "quite a remarkable young man in every aspect of his life: school, sports, religion and most of all, music," possessing, "charisma, character, values."

Joshua has provided service through music at his church for senior services and other events - as both pianist and tenor sax player. He has performed at nursing homes, service clubs, retirement facilities, community banks and malls, and is always ready to perform for community events when asked. In addition, he has performed with the Florida West Coast Symphony, and in Federation Recitals. He has consistently received awards for his performances in Federation events and Student Day testing. He is also quite adept at jazz improvisation and is the founder of a band - in which he plays tenor sax.

Through his school (St. Stephen's Episcopal School) Joshua volunteered two weeks to work with the Head Start students, in the "Head Start for Art" program. He has been highly recommended for this award by his high school music teacher, band director and his church music director - who praises him for both his willingness to serve and his expertise in performance.

FSMTA Pre-College Chamber Competition

The Pre-College Chamber Competition will be held on May 12, 2007 in conjunction with the other FSMTA Competitive events. It will be held at the University of Florida in Gainesville. This is an opportunity for all instrumental students to work together with each other and/or a pianist. One of the most wonderful things about music is sharing and making music with other musicians. All instrumentalists are encouraged to enter this exciting competition. Official rules are included in this newsletter, and if there are any questions, you may contact Liz Kiebler at (904) 278-9781. The application will appear on the web site soon so we look forward to seeing some great ensembles in May.

FSMTA PRE-COLLEGE CHAMBER MUSIC COMPETITION OFFICIAL RULES

1. Pre-college ensembles from schools in Florida are eligible to compete provided an active member of FSMTA has coached them. A pre-college student who has not completed high school at the time of application.
2. Ensembles may consist of any instrumental groupings, but should perform original rather than transcribed works of generally recognized musical standards.
3. Ensemble size should be two or more performers with no more than one player on each part, with a director only if the work is usually performed in this manner or if a director is needed because of the size or complexity of the work. A vocal ensemble should be two or more vocalists without soloists or piano as an accompaniment. A string ensemble should have a minimum of two and a maximum of eight performers. An instrumental ensemble should have minimum of two performers or vocal and instrument other than piano. A piano may be used in groups no fewer than two.
4. Ensembles with only piano and one other instrument may be considered chamber music as long as the piano is not an accompaniment as opposed to pieces that use piano as an equally collaborative instrument. Any repertoire should be approved by the chairman.
5. No changes of repertoire may happen once the repertoire has been submitted.
6. Length of performance should not exceed approximately 10-15 minutes.
7. The contest will be a live audition at State Competitive Events Day. One copy of the score, unmarked except for the measure numbers, is to be provided for the judges. No illegal photocopies will be acceptable, and if presented will be automatically disqualified. If an entrant has used a legally produced photocopy for study, it is this copy that must be presented to adjudicators together with a copy of the letter in which permission is granted by the copyright holder.
8. The application fee is \$35.00 and must accompany the application. A check or money order must be made payable to FSMTA. The application and fee must be submitted by certified mail (return receipt requested) to the FSMTA Pre-College Chamber Music Competition Chairman and be postmarked forty days before State Competitive Events Day.
9. Applications must be signed and submitted by the ensemble coach. Information must include the title, composer, and timing of the composition(s), and the name, address, age, year in school, name of school, and instrument of each performer.

Important District Student Day Information

The FSMTA Student Activities Meeting took place on Saturday, October 28 at the state conference in St. Petersburg. Thanks to all who attended and contributed their input, as there were several District Student Day issues that were discussed and voted on. It was passed that "effective immediately sight reading will continue to be a requirement on the DSD performance exam and that it be considered a 1-point bonus on the keyboard skills portion of the exam." I will be sending a postal notification to all DSD Chairs regarding this addition. I will also be including grading guidelines for the theory and aural tests so that grading is uniform throughout the state.

A committee was appointed to look into awarding medals for students who qualify for "State Honors" status (passing both written tests and achieving honors on the performance exam). This would begin in 2008. Some districts already do this, but giving the same award throughout the state will make it uniform.

Victoria Williams and I are currently working to clarify certain instructions on the 2008 aural and written theory tests. Suggestions for consideration can be forwarded to me at tmurphymus@yahoo.com.

FSMTA COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARDS

Applications for the 2006 – 2007 Le Roy Greenspan FSMTA Community Service Award and the Local Presidents Community Service Award have been distributed to all Local and District Presidents and will be accepted through March 15, 2007. Applicants must study with an FSMTA member and will be judged for their leadership, achievement, and service to the community in the field of music.

Are you a new member of FSMTA? Or perhaps you have been a member for many years, but have never recommended any of your students for these awards. Let me explain what they are and how your students can apply.

The Greenspan Award

This award, funded by Roslyn Greenspan in memory of her husband, is given to a high school senior (or junior who has received approval for early admission to college). Students are judged on achievement in the last three years of high school. State winners receive a plaque and five hundred dollars.

The Local Presidents Award

This award is given to a ninth grade student. Students are judged on achievements in seventh, eighth, and ninth grade. State winners receive a plaque and one hundred dollars.

Procedure

Obtain an application from your local or district president or download from our web site, fsmta.org

Survey your students. Have any of your students in twelfth or ninth grade been involved in community service in the field of music during the past three years?

Have them record on the application their service activities in school, church or synagogue, community, and personal activities in music.

Make sure all rules and instructions are followed.

Give the application to your local president who will then appoint a committee to select the county winner of

both awards.

Applications must be submitted to the county committee by March 15th. A certificate and a plaque are given to each county winner by FSMTA. The local association may also elect to give a plaque. Honorable mentions receive a certificate. These awards should be presented at the student's high school Senior Awards Assembly.

Winning entries from each county must be submitted to the state chairman by April 1st. The local MTA (not the applicant) sends a fee of \$25 payable to FSMTA; this must accompany the application.

A state winner for both awards will then be selected from the county winner applicants. The winners are presented a plaque and cash award at the FSMTA State Conference in the fall.

Reminders and Suggestions

Prepare a press release for your local newspaper after you have selected your winners. This is great publicity for our organization.

Teachers, please survey your students; do you have any that may be able to apply in the next two years? If so, have them record their community service activities in the field of music as they go along. This makes the application process much easier for the student. Keep it on file in your studio.

Show the application to parents of students who may be eligible to apply in the near future. This is a wonderful incentive for them to be supportive of any community service events you have scheduled for your studio. You might also explain these awards in your studio policy.

Don't forget your younger students (Local Presidents Award); these young people are our future in music.

Leroy Greenspan Memorial FSMTA Community Service Award 2006

The winner of the 2006 LeRoy Greenspan Memorial FSMTA Community Service Award is Mark Daniel Hakes of Lee County, District 7. He is a recent graduate of Cypress Lakes High School and a voice student of Helen Niedung. As winner, he received a check in the amount of \$500 and a plaque.

Mark holds an impressive record of community service in the field of music - with 1065 hours to his credit. He has shared his talents with residents of nursing homes and senior citizen facilities, and has sung, as a volunteer, with the local opera company. He has also sung with a

number of community and church choirs as both section leader and soloist as well as with the school chorus and the West Coast Symphony Chorus. Mark was a member of the All-State Boys Choir and the All-County Choir in the eleventh and twelfth grades, and earned membership in the ACDA (American Choral Directors Association) National Honor Choir. He performed in the SWFLMTA Pianothon annually during his three years of high school.

In addition, Mark has won awards from both the National Federation of Music Clubs and the Florida Vocal Association and was named "Young Artist"

for Ave Maria University. In 2005 Mark was the winner of the SWFLMTA voice scholarship and the second place winner of the Calusa Musicale Scholarship Auditions. He also traveled to Europe that summer with the S.W. Florida Symphony Chorus as a merit scholarship winner for exemplary service and outstanding commitment in his field.

Mark entered college this fall as a voice major at Stetson University. Due to a family commitment at Stetson the weekend of the FSMTA Conference neither Mark or his parents were able to personally accept the award. Mark wanted the membership to know that he and his family were deeply sorry for their inability to attend. He and his parents are extremely appreciative of the honor and very grateful for the award. Helen Niedung was also unable to attend but says of Mark, "It is rare to find a young man like Mark, who is extremely thoughtful of others and always offers help in any way he can".

Accepting the award for Mark was Mary Griffen Seal who had accompanied him on numerous occasions. Mary praised him for his character, talent, and his giving nature.

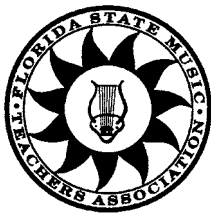
