



# President's Message

For most of us the New Year represents the time for festivals, evaluations, competitions, and recitals, AND FSMTA STUDENT DAY!

In the mid-'80's when I enthusiastically resumed my piano teaching after a 7 year hiatus during which I completed my degree in Music at FIU and a year of graduate study at the U of M, I again became an active member of my local association. There was much talk about 'Student Day', and shortly thereafter I was asked to be a Judge for P, L1, L2, L3, & L4. It was then that I realized what a wonderful program it was. How much more the students experienced of written and aural theory as well as keyboard skills! After I had judged for four years, I thought 'Why am I not putting my own students into this?' And have done so ever since.

If you have hesitated to enroll students - don't hesitate another year. Even if you put ONE student in, that student will be enriched beyond the normal lesson experience. Some Districts have festivals built around Student Day, some have special recitals for those who receive honors in performance, some have Recitals for those who receive honors in all three categories. Some recitals take place the day of the test, some at a later date. Some Districts have over 400 Students enrolled, while others have 25. But whatever your District does, I urge you to get involved,

for the benefit of both you and your students.

Once begun, this commitment follows and grows in the ensuing years.

ALSO

If you have never gone to a National Conference think about going to Austin this year!. Many of us don't think about the National Organization or beyond our local association. However, most our yearly dues go to MTNA. Yes, we all enjoy reading the American Music Teacher Magazine, and some of our state teachers enroll students in the MTNA Competitions each fall, and some have received the various grants offered, but, only a handful of our 900+ members attend the five-day Conference. I have attended three since being a member of MTNA and will be

representing our State in Austin this year and in Toronto in 2007. There are so many programs/workshops to attend, and over 700 exhibits, (and yes, there is even a mailing service to send home what you don't want to carry with you). Hearing the concerts, the winning compositions and watching the competitions has been especially an eye opener for me. You think that the last student you heard has to be the winner - until the next performer comes along with an 'electrifying edge' and blows the prior competitor away! Give your Dec/Jan Magazine a second look and fill out the application. Let me know if you are going. We will try to have Florida member dinners and lunches together.

# **Byrd Piano Ensemble and Gray Perry Competitions**

**T**he annual Byrd Piano Ensemble and Gray Perry competitions will be held on Saturday, May 20th and Sunday, May 21st as part of the FSMTA Competitive Events. They will be held at the University of Florida School of Music in Gainesville. Deadline for applications is April 8th, 2006. I will be chairing both of these events. Teachers wishing to submit students for either the Byrd Piano Ensemble or the Gray Perry Young Collegiate Piano Award should request blanks from me and return the application forms by April 8th. Requirements for both are listed in the Handbook of Student Activities, or I will be glad to send them to you.

The Byrd Piano Ensemble Award has two categories: Pre college (students who have not completed high school at the time the application is submitted) and College. Students present a short program of choice: Pre college: 5-15 min. College: 8-20 minutes. Students should present piano ensemble compositions of generally recognized musical standards. Memorization is not required. Chairman can send list of representative repertoire.

Gray Perry Young Collegiate Piano Award is for college students in their first and second years of college piano study. Any piano student of a FSMTA member who is at a private or public college or university in Florida is eligible for this competition. Students should perform two or three memorized pieces from contrasting style periods, total length of 15-20 minutes. This is an excellent chance for the younger students to gain experience in competition performance.

I hope you will be interested in these two excellent competitions, and will look forward to having good participation in these events.

Applications are now being accepted by the LeRoy Greenspan Community Service Award and the Local Presidents Community Service Award. Each award is given to the student of a member teacher, in recognition of leadership, achievement, and service to the community in the field of music.

Are you a new member of FSMTA? Or perhaps you have been a member for many years, but have never recommended any of your students for these awards. Let me explain what they are and how your students can apply.

### The Greenspan Award

This award, funded by Roslyn Greenspan in memory of her husband, is given to a high school senior (or junior who has received approval for early admission to college). Students are judged on achievement in the last three years of high school. State winners receive a plaque and five hundred dollars.

### The Local Presidents Award

This award is given to a ninth grade student. Students are judged on achievements in seventh, eighth, and ninth grade. State winners receive a plaque and one hundred dollars.

### Procedure

1. Obtain an application from your local or district president or download from our website, [fsmta.org](http://fsmta.org).
2. Survey your students. Have any of your students in twelfth or ninth grade been involved in community service in the field of music during the past three years?
3. Have them record on the application their service activities in school, church or synagogue, community, and personal activities in music.

4. Make sure all rules and instructions are followed.
5. Give the application to your local president who will then appoint a committee to select the county winner of both awards.
6. Applications must be submitted to the county committee by March 15th. A certificate and a plaque are given to each county winner by FSMTA. The local association may also elect to give a plaque. Honorable mentions receive a certificate. These awards should be presented at the student's high school Senior Awards Assembly.
7. Winning entries from each county must be submitted to the state chairman by April 1st. The local MTA (not the applicant) sends a fee of \$25 payable to FSMTA; this must accompany the application.
8. A state winner for both awards will then be selected from the county winner applicants. The winners are presented a plaque and cash award at the FSMTA State Conference in the fall.

### Reminders and Suggestions

1. Prepare a press release for your local newspaper after you have selected your winners. This is great publicity for our organization.
2. Teachers, please survey your students; do you have any that may be able to apply in the next two years? If so, have them record their community service activities in the field of music as they go along. This makes the application process much easier for the student. Keep it on file in your studio.
3. Show the application to parents of students who may be eligible to apply in the near future. This is a wonderful incentive for them to be supportive of any community service events you have scheduled for your studio. You might also explain these awards in your studio policy.
4. Don't forget your younger students (Local Presidents Award); these young people are our future in music.

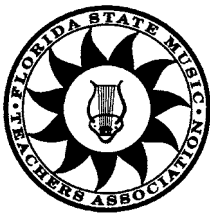
